RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR USAGE AND DISCIPLINE IN THE GOLF SPORTS FACILITIES - LMC

Introduction La Manga Club, S.L. (hereinafter referred to as the “Property,” the “Owner,” or “LMC”) is the proprietor of the sports facilities, which encompass, among others, the North Course, the South Course, the West Course, the Par 47, the Clubhouse, and the Pitch & Putt of La Manga Club (hereinafter, for the purposes of this document, referred to as the “Sports Facilities”).

This document delineates the rules and regulations governing the use and discipline at the Sports Facilities, establishing the minimum standards necessary for the proper enjoyment of these facilities by all participants (hereinafter, the “Rules”). For the purposes of these Rules, “participants” refers to any individual utilizing the Sports Facilities, including members of the Club (hereinafter, the “Members”), their family members or guests, as well as any other users, irrespective of whether they are engaged in playing golf, caddying, or utilizing the practice facilities (hereinafter, collectively referred to as the “Participants” or, individually, as the “Participant”).

LMC assumes complete responsibility for guaranteeing that players experience all the courtesies, comforts, and services provided by LMC, while ensuring adherence to the Rules at all times. Consequently, LMC staff are required to enforce compliance with these Rules, and players are expected to be aware of, adhere to, and assist in their enforcement. Any violation of the Rules or conduct detrimental to the interests of the Club will result in the implementation of LMC's disciplinary regulations against the offender.

These Rules will take effect on November 30, 2021, and serve as an update and renewal of all prior texts. The Owner retains the right to amend the Rules at any time.

Section 1:

GENERAL CLUB REGULATIONS

1.01 The operating hours of the LMC Sports Facilities will be determined and announced by the Owner.

1.02 The Golf Director oversees the Sports Facilities.

1.03 LMC is governed by all relevant local, regional, and national regulations regarding the consumption of alcoholic beverages. Additionally, LMC will refrain from selling or serving alcoholic beverages for consumption outside the Sports Facilities unless explicitly permitted by the Golf Director.

1.04 All food and beverages consumed on the Club premises must be supplied by the Club, unless explicitly authorized by the Golf Director. This provision excludes small quantities of food and drink for personal consumption during play. External catering is prohibited unless expressly authorized by the Golf Director.

1.05 Any initiative aimed at raising funds for any cause (political, ecological, social, etc.) must receive explicit authorization from the Golf Director.

1.06 Players are required to conduct themselves with courtesy towards all LMC staff. Consequently, any inappropriate behavior, whether verbal or physical, directed by a Player towards Club staff may lead to suspension and/or expulsion from the Sports Facilities. In the case of Members, this may also extend to their family members or guests, resulting in suspension and/or expulsion from Club membership.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR USAGE AND DISCIPLINE IN THE GOLF SPORTS FACILITIES - LMC

1.07 All Club employees operate under the supervision of the Golf Director, who is responsible for Authority over them rests solely with the designated personnel. No Player may, under any circumstances, reprimand or impose disciplinary actions on LMC employees. Any conduct by an LMC employee that fails to adhere to Club standards must be reported to the Golf Director.

Foul and abusive language will not be tolerated. Its usage will lead to the suspension of privileges. apply to the relevant Player.

1.09 Players shall not request special or preferential services from Club employees.

1.10 Access to the kitchen, service areas, and any other private areas of the Club representing the Players.

1.11 Vehicles are required to be parked in the designated areas specified by the Club. diligently circumventing any traffic obstructions, unless explicitly directed by the Club.

1.12 Any performance or exhibition at the Club must receive explicit authorization from the Director. from Golf.

1.13 Unless explicitly permitted by LMC, publication, promotion, The distribution of advertising within the Club includes the utilization of Sports Facilities for the advantage of a business not sanctioned by the Club, as well as the use of LMC materials.

1.14 The utilization of the LMC name and/or logo is strictly prohibited for any purpose. The following exceptions apply: Utilization of the LMC logo by teams representing members of the LMC Golf Club in comparable leagues and competitions.

1.15 Access to the Facilities by dogs and any other animals belonging to the Players is prohibited. Sports facilities and golf courses. Service animals are not permitted.

1.16 Smoking is prohibited within the Sports Facilities, except in the designated outdoor areas specifically allocated for this purpose.

1.17 Access to the sports facilities with any type of weapon is strictly prohibited.

1.18 The Club Member list and associated information is proprietary to LMC. Any utilization, The delivery or disclosure of the information contained therein by a Member or any Player is strictly prohibited and will be regarded as a significant violation of the Club Rules, potentially leading to expulsion or the imposition of sanctions. Access to the sports facilities is prohibited for individuals under the age of seventeen.

Juniors are prohibited from accessing the facilities unless explicitly authorized by the Club or accompanied by an adult. In all instances, a prerequisite is that the Junior's legal representative must sign a document at the Golf Office reception, assuming full responsibility for the Junior's use of the Sports Facilities and any damages the Junior may incur.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR USAGE AND DISCIPLINE IN THE GOLF SPORTS FACILITIES - LMC

1.22 Players are required to adhere to the Rules of Golf and the Etiquette outlined in Appendix A.

1.21 Children under the age of sixteen (16) are not permitted in the bar lounge areas unless accompanied by an adult.

Section 2: LOSS OR DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY OR PERSONAL INJURY

2.01 Players bear full responsibility for their personal belongings. The Club shall not be held liable for no loss or damage incurred by property utilized or stored by Players at the Sports Facilities.

2.02 The Club's property and furnishings must be treated with respect, ensuring they remain in their designated locations unless prior explicit authorization is obtained from the Club.

Players shall be held accountable for any damage inflicted upon (1) Club property, (2) Club personnel, or (3) any activity conducted, organized, coordinated, or sponsored by the Club. The expenses incurred from the damage may be directly billed to the account of the responsible Member or Player.

2.03 Any Player who engages in any contest, game, exercise, competition, or other activity

Any activity conducted, organized, promoted, or sponsored by the Club, whether on or off its premises, will be at the member's sole risk, and they will consequently assume the consequences of their actions or omissions. This includes any use of equipment, applications, facilities, privileges, or services of any kind belonging to the Club, whether owned, leased, or otherwise, including, without limitation, the use of golf carts.

Any losses, costs, claims, injuries, damages, or liabilities incurred or caused by a Player, whether through action or omission, shall be the exclusive responsibility of the Player. The Player shall assume the consequences of such action or omission, thereby releasing LMC, along with its administrators, shareholders, partners, directors, employees, legal representatives, and agents, from any liability.

2.04 Any claim or demand against LMC resulting from the actions or omissions of a Player shall be directed to that Player, who shall bear all expenses and costs incurred in the defense of LMC, including legal fees and attorney's costs, in all instances where their involvement is required.

Section 3: SERVICES AND ACTIVITIES OFFERED AT THE CLUB

3.01 The Ownership encourages all Players to engage in the social, cultural, and recreational events provided by the Club.

3.02 Access to the Sports Facilities by third parties is prohibited unless explicitly authorized by LMC.

3.03 At Management's discretion, weekly events, tournaments, and competitions will be organized.

3.04 The Property promotes the utilization of the Clubhouse facilities by Members for the

Private events are allowed on any day or night, as long as they do not disrupt the normal operations of the Club or the services typically offered to members. In all instances, advance notification to the Golf Director is necessary to confirm dates and availability.

3.05 Private events are not allowed on the Club premises without prior approval.

Prior approval from the Golf Director is required. The Club Member sponsoring the private event will be accountable for the behavior of their guests, as well as any damage incurred by them or the event decorations. Additionally, they will be responsible for the removal of all event decorations.

3.06 Public and special events will be organized at the discretion of LMC. Some of these events may lead to the partial or complete closure of the Sports Facilities. Members will be appropriately informed of such changes.

Section 4: GOLF RESERVATIONS AND REGISTRATION

4.01 The tee times and golf shop hours will be displayed at the Golf reception.

The Golf Director will assess the playability of the course, and his decision shall be deemed final.

4.02 To utilize the Sports Facilities, it is essential to secure a prior reservation through the designated online platform. This reservation will be linked to a scheduled game start time. The Golf Director retains the authority to accept reservations for special events. Such requests will be acknowledged but will only be confirmed one month prior to the scheduled playing date.

4.03 When the course is played from two tees, players on the course will have priority over Participants will commence provided they adhere to the designated Time Control. Otherwise, games will be alternated as directed by the Starter/Marshall overseeing the course.

4.04 The Golf Office reserves the right to restrict reservations that are considered abusive or harmful to other patrons.

Players, similarly, the Golf Office retains the right to amend any reservation without prior notice and consolidate groups into parties of four players to enhance tee time efficiency.

4.05 Booking restrictions shall not apply to guests of the Hotel Príncipe Felipe, which is capable of managing Reservations may be made at any time, provided they align with the principles of hotel business demand.

4.06 Reservation cancellations and no-shows will adhere to the following regulations:

Cancellations made with a minimum of 48 hours' notice prior to the Reservations canceled with less than 48 hours' notice will incur no penalty. However, cancellations made within this timeframe will be subject to a penalty amounting to 100% of the designated price.

All cancellations must be processed via the online platform.

The individual who completes the booking will be accountable for any no-shows by additional players.

The player of the group will incur the cancellation penalty charges.

Failure to check in and register at least 10 minutes prior to the scheduled start time.

Reserved, it may serve as a basis for the cancellation or delay of the initial reservation.

Players who arrive after the scheduled start time forfeit their right to participate in the game.

use of that start time is governed by the provisions of the Golf Director.

Notwithstanding the aforementioned, on an exceptional basis, the Golf Director may waive the application of these rules in cases of verified illness or inclement weather.

Section 5: VEHICLES

5.01 The Property offers a fleet of buggies for rental by the Players. Their utilization in the

The utilization of buggies not owned by LMC requires explicit authorization from the Golf Director. The use of buggies is contingent upon the rates outlined in the price list, which may be subject to revisions.

5.02 Players may operate buggies provided that they are at least 18 years of age;

They must possess a valid driver's license and maintain current insurance that provides coverage in the event of an accident.

LMC disclaims any responsibility for, and is excluded from coverage of, accidents involving drivers under 18 years of age, irrespective of whether they are unaccompanied or accompanied by an adult.

5.03 Buggies are permitted to be operated on golf courses solely during their hours of operation.

The buggies on the property are restricted to the golf course premises. Owners of buggies not affiliated with LMC will bear full responsibility for any consequences arising from their use.

5.04 Only two individuals and two golf teams are permitted per buggy.

5.05 Traffic signs in sports facilities and access points are obligatory.
for carriages.

5.06 The use of buggies is allowed on streets, though it is subject to restrictions imposed by prevailing conditions.

Weather or maintenance conditions permitting, the Golf Director may restrict the number of buggies per round to safeguard the course. Buggies are prohibited on the greens, around the greens, and on the tees. Noncompliance with these regulations will be regarded as a significant violation of the Rules. Buggy paths must always be utilized, with particular attention given to the teeing and green areas.

5.07 The use of buggies is forbidden in hazardous areas, including slopes, ravines, and similar locations.
marshes and refuse.

5.08 Players who improperly utilize a buggy will be responsible for any damage and injuries incurred to the Property, including damage to the vehicle itself.

5.09 The Player utilizing a buggy acknowledges and accepts full responsibility for any consequences resulting from its use.
The Player

LMC, along with its administrators, employees, shareholders, partners, legal representatives, and agents, shall bear no liability for any and all damages, whether direct or indirect, that arise from or are related to the Player's use and operation of the buggy.

5.10 Players arriving at or departing from the Sports Facilities via buggy must not traverse them.

Golf courses. All buggies not in use during a round must enter and exit the Club via the designated buggy streets and paths.

5.11 LMC may impose a ban on the use of the buggy for those Players who fail to comply with the
as outlined in this section. In any event, noncompliance with these rules will be regarded as a significant violation of the Regulations.

Section 6: PRACTICE FACILITY (INCLUDING PUTTING GREENS, PRACTICE BUNKERS, AND CHIPPING AREA)

6.01 During regular operations, the practice field is accessible at the times specified by the
Golf Office. The driving range will be closed for maintenance upon announcement at the Golf Office reception.

6.02 Practice balls are permitted solely on this course and are prohibited on all other golf courses.

Tokens or cards for the acquisition of balls are available for purchase at the golf office reception.

6.03 Buggies are prohibited on the practice range. They may be parked in the designated areas.
specifically designed for this purpose.

6.04 Balls must be thrown from the specified areas. Throwing balls from areas not designated for this practice.

6.05 Practice field players must be suitably attired in accordance with the established dress codes of apparel as specified in these Standards.

6.06 The collection of balls in the practice area is strictly prohibited.

6.07 Noncompliance with the regulations of the practice field will lead to the revocation of privileges and/or Player rights therein will be regarded as a significant violation of the Rules.

Section 7: DISABILITIES

7.01 Handicaps are determined in accordance with the regulations set forth by the Royal Spanish Golf Federation and the World.

Handicap System. Non-World Handicaps will be accepted or modified in accordance with R&A and USGA regulations.

World Handicaps may be modified by the competition committee.

7.02 The Starter may request handicaps. All members licensed by the Royal Spanish Federation Golf players may participate in club tournaments. All submitted handicaps are subject to review by the tournament committee.

7.03 Handicap certificates will be mandatory in all areas.

Section 8: GOLF APPAREL

All players and their companions utilizing the sports facilities are expected to dress suitably for the environment and ambiance at LMC. Members are also required to inform their guests of the dress code stipulations. All members bear the responsibility of ensuring that the golf attire of their guests and family members adheres to the standards delineated in the Dress Code, which is included in Appendix B.

SECTION 9: MISCELLANEOUS

Golf courses are designated solely for the purpose of playing golf, unless explicitly authorized by the Golf Director. Activities such as picnicking, cycling, kite flying, soccer, recreational walking, jogging, walking pets, scootering, and any other similar pursuits are prohibited on the golf courses without the Golf Director's approval.

Professional golf lessons may only be conducted with explicit authorization from the Golf Director.

Players will be prohibited from purchasing golf balls on the courses from individuals not affiliated with the club.

Noncompliance with this regulation may be regarded as a significant violation.

The Golf Director will assess whether adverse weather conditions hinder play on the golf course. If players are unable to complete 12 holes, the reservation will be canceled, and a voucher for a future round will be issued. LMC will not offer any additional compensation.

The Property reserves the right to close the golf course to play whenever there is a potential risk of damage to the course, or if closure is required for maintenance or other special events. LMC may designate specific dates during which portions of the day will be allocated for special groups.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR USAGE AND DISCIPLINE IN THE GOLF SPORTS FACILITIES - LMC

Course maintenance activities will be communicated in advance on the La Manga Club website. Reduced rates will no longer be applicable once maintenance work has been completed.

Players are responsible for securing their own insurance coverage for injuries incurred or caused during play. The Property shall not be held liable for the aforementioned.

APPENDIX A:

The following regulations serve as guidelines for players concerning their golf practice and behavior on the course. It is imperative that all players demonstrate mutual respect and adhere to these rules as well as the dress code. Golf is predominantly played without the oversight of a referee. The integrity of each player is crucial in ensuring consideration for fellow players, maintenance of the course, and compliance with the Rules.

All players are required to behave in a disciplined manner, consistently exhibiting courtesy and sportsmanship, irrespective of the level of competition.

RULES OF PLAY At LMC, the Rules of Golf established by the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews, as sanctioned by the Royal Spanish Golf Federation, are in effect. The Golf Director will issue any pertinent local regulations. The current rules are displayed on the notice board at the golf reception. For significant events (Professionals, RFEF, Owners' Championship, etc.), specific versions or modifications may be implemented as determined by the competition committee.

Etiquette Guidelines

All participants are required to adhere to the standards of etiquette established in these Rules.

Etiquette in the practice of golf is an essential and inseparable aspect of the game that has come to define the Golf holds significant value on a global scale. Within the golfing community, etiquette encompasses demonstrating respect for the course being played and acknowledging the effort invested in its creation. It involves ensuring that the game is conducted safely, allowing all players to enjoy the round as much as you do. In summary, it is essential to demonstrate respect at all times for others who may be present on the field.

PLAYERS: DUTIES

Very few players would concede to being slow in the game, yet it is undeniably in the hands of

Everyone, please increase your pace slightly. It is essential to keep up with the group ahead. If, for any reason, a player in a group lags behind, it is the responsibility of the others to remind them not to impede the progress of the remaining players.

We must respond constructively. If the group is lagging, there is no need to hurry, but we should endeavor to accelerate the pace as much as possible. Should the group fall a hole behind the group ahead, resulting in delays for other players on the course, we must ensure that the group maintains a pace that enables them to adhere to the scheduled playing times.

If there is no group in front and the group behind is being restrained, the latter will be prompted to advance.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR USAGE AND DISCIPLINE AT DEGOLF-LMC SPORTS FACILITIES

You must be prepared to play. If it is not your turn, utilize that time to get ready so that when your turn arrives, you are fully prepared. Don your glove, evaluate the distance, and gauge the wind speed and direction. Determine the type of shot you intend to take. When it is your turn, act swiftly: make your decision on the shot and execute it. Only one practice swing is necessary; there is no need to swing the club multiple times.

If each player were to reduce their routine by a few seconds prior to launching, the cumulative effect would be highly significant.

Bunkers: Prior to departing from a bunker, players must diligently fill and level any holes and footprints that may have been created during play. If a rake is available in the vicinity of the bunker, it may be utilized for this task.

Players are required to meticulously repair any holes in the divots as well as any damage a ball may have inflicted on the green, regardless of whether it was caused by the player. Once all players in the group have completed the hole, they must address any damage resulting from their footwear. Players should refrain from harming the course by removing divots during practice swings or by striking the ground with their clubs. It is essential for players to ensure that the green remains undamaged when placing their bags or the flagstick. To prevent damage to the hole, players and caddies must not linger near it and must exercise particular caution when handling the flagstick and retrieving the ball from the hole. The clubhead must not be utilized to extract balls from a hole. Players must avoid leaning on the clubheads on the green, especially when removing the ball from the hole. The flagstick must be correctly replaced in the hole before players depart from the green.

Players are required to adhere to the regulations governing the use of golf carts.

Players are required to demonstrate respect for their fellow participants on the field and refrain from disrupting their play through unnecessary movements, conversations, or noises. Electronic devices brought onto the field must not divert the attention of other players.

Players are required to strike the ball solely during their turn, and when another player is preparing to take their shot, they must remain clear of the ball, positioned directly behind or directly adjacent to the hole.

On the green, players must ensure they do not obstruct another player's line of sight. When a player is putting, the remaining players should avoid casting shadows on their line of sight and must remain on the green until all other players have completed their putts.

In stroke play, the player responsible for recording scores must verify the score with the other players and document it before proceeding to the next tee.

Players must ensure that no individuals are standing nearby who could be struck by the club, ball, or any stone, pebble, branch, or similar object during their swings or practice. Players should wait until those ahead are out of range. It is imperative for players to notify the nearest greenkeepers when they are about to take a shot that may pose a risk to them. If a player's ball is heading toward a direction where there is a possibility of hitting someone, the player must promptly issue a warning by shouting. The customary warning term is "fore."

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR USAGE AND DISCIPLINE AT DEGOLF-LMC SPORTS FACILITIES

When nearing a green, players should position their buggies on the fairway in the most direct line to the next tee. This practice can save up to thirty minutes per round. Avoid leaving your buggy in front of the green, as this necessitates a return trip to retrieve it, causing delays for other players awaiting its removal before taking their shots. This guideline also applies to electric carts and wheelers, which should not be driven onto greens or tees.

On average, a four-ball hole should take no more than 15 minutes to complete, resulting in a total of 4.5 hours per round.

The Marshals maintain pace of play charts that inform Players of the anticipated time for each tee, considering the length of the holes and the distances between greens and the subsequent tees. Subpar performance may necessitate the presentation of handicap certificates and/or a request for Players to vacate the course. In such instances, no compensation will be provided.

Players utilizing a buggy must adhere to the pace of play established by those who are walking.

Players are encouraged to collect the tees. Care should be taken when disposing of broken tees, as they can damage lawnmowers and puncture buggy tires. Holders will be provided for this purpose.

You must enter and exit the bunkers at the level nearest to the ball. Prior to departing the bunker, you are required to smooth the sand with a rake, positioning the rake head within the bunker and the end of the handle on the grass at the edge of the bunker.

All games, whether involving one, two, three, or four balls, necessitate the same positioning on the court. Singles or two-ball games may be paired with other players, if available, at the starter's discretion. Each player is required to possess their own set of golf clubs.

"Cutting-in" is strictly prohibited under any circumstances. All players are required to check in with a starter. The game may not be initiated from houses or residences under any conditions.

All players who cease play for any reason (such as breaks) must be at the next tee before the subsequent players arrive; otherwise, they will forfeit their position on the golf course and must seek permission from the Starter to continue play.

It is prohibited to dispose of trash or any objects in the field (including bottles, fruit scraps, empty ball cans, etc.).

The sports facilities are equipped with garbage containers at the end.

Driving practice on the golf courses is not permitted. The Property provides the driving range for Players to utilize for this purpose.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR USAGE AND DISCIPLINE IN THE GOLF SPORTS FACILITIES - LMC

In the event of lightning in the vicinity, all play must cease, and players are required to seek suitable shelter without delay. Marshals will signal this occurrence by sounding a horn.

Please be advised that the water utilized for irrigating the courses may contain contaminants and hazardous substances. Players should refrain from allowing their mouths to come into contact with golf balls, as this may result in severe health issues.

APPENDIX B: ATTIRE REGULATIONS

Golf attire must be tidy and adhere to the Club's standards as well as the traditions of the game.

The wearing of t-shirts, sleeveless shirts (for men), jeans, athletic wear, swimwear, or shorts that extend above the knee is prohibited.

The use of flip-flops and sandals is not permitted in the Sports Facilities.

Jeans will be permitted in the Clubhouse provided they are clean and are

formal, exhibit a uniform color, and are free from holes, tears, scratches, or fraying

The use of footwear featuring soft cleats is mandatory on the playing fields. The use of any other type of footwear, including shoes with metal cleats, is strictly prohibited.

The golf shop is well-stocked with suitable apparel, allowing for any sartorial missteps to be promptly and effortlessly corrected.

ANNEX C: DISCIPLINARY FRAMEWORK

The Marshall is required to notify Players if they may be in violation of these Rules and will document incidents along with the names of the Players involved in the Incident Book.

Noncompliance with the Rules, the disciplinary framework, and inappropriate conduct by the Players in relation to both will be regarded as a serious offense, subject to sanctions imposed by the Club.

TYPES OF VIOLATIONS

Infractions are categorized into three classifications: minor, serious, and very serious.

The subsequent actions will be classified as minor offenses:

Any violations of the Rules, excluding those categorized as serious or very serious infringements.

Causing damage to the Sports Facilities due to negligence or lack of care, without affecting the financial responsibility of the Player as stipulated in these Rules.

- Deliberate non-compliance with any of the regulations.
- The occurrence of three (3) minor infractions within a span of 12 consecutive months.
- Disrespectful conduct that inflicts physical or psychological harm on fellow players or employees of LMC, located within the Sports Facilities.
- Inflicting harm on the greens.
- Purchasing golf balls at the Sports Facilities from individuals who are not members of the Club.
- Gather balls from the practice area.
- Operating buggies on the greens, around the greens, and on the tees.

The following will be regarded as grave offenses:

- Noncompliance with the stipulations of the Spanish Penal Code and other pertinent regulations and implementing measures, or to be or have been convicted of a crime or to have been expelled from a club or association for reasons pertaining to honor.
- To inflict significant and intentional harm or damage, or to endeavor to inflict significant and intentional harm to the club's amenities, personnel, or pursuits.
- Removing equipment from the Sports Facilities, including golf balls, clubs, practice baskets, and similar items.
- Aggressive conduct directed at fellow players or LMC personnel.
- Inability to amend a significant violation.
- The commission of three (3) significant infractions within a span of two consecutive years.
- Failure to remit Club Fees or any other amounts due to the Club, including those that have been projected. in these Rules.
- This obligation will endure for as long as the debt remains unsettled.
- Club fees and any other outstanding payments will incur legal interest.

PENALTIES FOR NON-COMPLIANCE AND INFRACTIONS

Concerning the sanctions regime, the specified infractions will lead to the following penalties.

Please be advised that Members are accountable as Players under this provision concerning the behavior of their family members and guests. Specifically, if a sanction cannot be imposed directly on a family member or guest of a Member, the Member will bear responsibility for the sanction.

a) Petty offenses:

Upon the commission of the initial offense, the Player will receive a verbal warning from the

- Director of Golf.
- In the case of a second violation, the Player will be issued a written warning.
- In the event of a third violation during the specified period, the Player's right to utilize the Sports facilities for a duration of up to three (3) months. The suspension will be conveyed in writing.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR USAGE AND DISCIPLINE IN THE GOLF SPORTS FACILITIES - LMC

b) Significant violations

The Player's right to utilize the Sports Facilities will be suspended for a duration of between 3 and 6 months. The suspension will be conveyed in writing.

c) Grave violations:

The Golf Director will record all violations and infractions. A declaration from the Golf Director will serve as adequate evidence of the violation or infraction.

Sanctioned players are entitled to submit any arguments they consider pertinent in writing to advocate for their rights. The LMC will provide a response within a maximum of one (1) month.

The sanctions will become effective from the date they are formally communicated in writing to the offending Player.
